Useful Tools

<u>Code Compare</u>- A free application for Windows that shows the differences between two text files.

Programmer's Notepad. A free text editor for Windows. It includes a word count.

<u>Jutoh</u>. A paid for program (about £35) that runs on Windows, Mac and Linux that creates eBooks in .mobi or .epub.

<u>FreeFileSync</u>. A free utility that runs on Windows, Mac or Linux. It simplifies backing up files by doing a sync between two folders, only copying the differences.

<u>Calibre</u>. Manage eBooks on Windows, Linux or Mac with this open source program. It lets you convert eBook files between different formats and copy on/off devices.

<u>FileZilla.</u> Useful utility for copying files between computers and servers.

Free and Open-Source image editors list. On Wikipedia.

Mind Mapping software. This is Mind Mate, an open source project with Windows installers.

<u>Snagit and Camtasia.</u> These are commercial screen grab and video recording and editing software.

Backup Services

<u>Dropbox.</u> Costing around £8 a month this gives you 2 TB (Terabytes) of remote storage. Just copy files into a Dropbox and they get whisked away. Handy for syncing data between computers on a network and also lets you easily produce download links for files too big to email.

BackBlaze. Cheaper than Dropbox (\$7 a month) and provides unlimited storage.
